



## Stock Market Challenge Teacher guide

This resource is designed to be either be delivered as a one off event or as a series of 1-3 lessons dependent upon how the teacher wishes to deliver the material. The material is designed in such a way that the 'Stock Market Challenge' can be delivered on a 'one off' basis or as a sequence of discrete lessons.

## Teacher guidance video

The worksheets (and interactive Google Sheet) are made up so that they run alongside the content of each video clip. (Sector update).

It is recommended that the sector updates are delivered sequentially.

4	The banking sector is severely hit by customers not being able to pay their mortgages.

Before the activities begin the attention should be brought to the Company fact files. By making a point of showing these at the beginning any misconceptions interpreting the information can be detected there.

It is important that the students understand that the information in the fact files provides valuable information on which trades to make. By making sure they watch the video files below, teachers can increase the likelihood that pupils look properly at this information.
